


Zuccardi Valle de Uco brings together three generations of our family.

CLIMATE

The mountain is the key to our identity. It gives us the landscape, the terrain, the water, the climate, and the soil. The Uco Valley is an authentic high-altitude desert.


The mountain range isolates us from the maritime influence of the Pacific Ocean, and the combination of altitude, terrain, and the short distance to the mountains provides us with an immense diversity in microclimates.

SOILS

The soils of the Uco Valley are of alluvial origin, formed by materials that descended from the Andes Mountains millions of years ago, transported by water. Thanks to this process, the soils are usually very complex and heterogeneous.

In the higher areas of the alluvial fans, where our vineyards are planted, we find very stony and calcareous soils.

The mountain has gifted us great diversity, and our challenge is to faithfully interpret it to express the identity of each place through the wine.



FINCA CANAL UCO

IG Paraje Altamira, Uco Valley 1100 m | 3609 ft

The Tunuyán River irrigates most of the vineyards in Mendoza, and the Canal Uco is the first canal that draws water from it. It has been the vital pulse of irrigation in the southern part of the Uco Valley for decades.

This was the first vineyard the family planted in the Uco Valley, marking the beginning of our journey discovering the identity of Paraje Altamira.

Alluvial soils of medium depth, subsoil with large granite stones covered in calcium carbonate.

Main varieties planted: Malbec, Cabernet Sauvignon, Cabernet Franc.



FINCA PIEDRA INFINITA

IG Paraje Altamira, Uco Valley 1100 m | 3609 ft

This vineyard is a unique place, with an impressive landscape. We had to move more than a thousand trucks filled with stones to make room for the vines. Cultivating this vineyard involves studying, working, knowing each row, each stone. Tirelessly exploring its immense diversity to be able to interpret it through the wine.

Shallow alluvial soils, subsoil with large granite stones covered in a thick layer of calcareous material.

Main varieties planted: Malbec, Cabernet Franc, Bonarda, Tempranillo.



FINCA LOS MEMBRILLOS

IG Paraje Altamira, Uco Valley 1060 m | 3478 ft

More than 20 years ago, a family of winegrowers planted this Cabernet Sauvignon vineyard, which reached our hands in 2008. There was an indelible stamp on it – the rows of quince trees surrounding the vineyard – conserving this tradition found in the oldest vineyards in the area.

Alluvial, calcareous soils with an abundance of large granite stones at variable depths.

Main varieties planted: Cabernet Sauvignon, Malbec, Semillon, Cabernet Franc.



FINCA LAS CUCHILLAS

IG San Pablo, Uco Valley 1400 m | 4593 ft

Due to its altitude and proximity to the mountains, San Pablo is one of the coldest places in the Uco Valley. Our arrival at Finca Las Cuchillas was motivated by the search for that cold climate and its calcareous soils.

The vineyard's name refers to the mountain ridges that run from west to east in that area, known as "cuchillas" (blades). Our vineyard is a true balcony to observe these typical features of this mountainous region.

Alluvial soils of medium depth, subsoil with stones covered by a thick layer of calcareous material.

Main varieties planted: Chardonnay, Malbec, Cabernet Franc, Albariño, Verdejo, Riesling, Semillon, Sauvignon Blanc, Bonarda.



FINCA LAS CERRILLADAS

Gualtallary, Uco Valley 1360 m | 4462 ft

This vineyard is planted at an altitude of 1360 meters | 4462 feet, at the foot of the Jaboncillo hills, called cerrilladas, in the paraje of Gualtallary that we know as "Monasterio." It is the result of our search for synthesis between the vineyard and the landscape. Its 30 parcels, surrounded by native vegetation of the area, respect the richness of the topography and soil types of this place, where caliche and gravel covered in calcareous material abound, amongst an authentic mountain desert climate.

Main varieties planted: Malbec, Chardonnay, Cabernet Franc, Bonarda.



FINCA AGUA DE LA JARILLA

Gualtallary, Uco Valley 1385 m | 4544 ft

This vineyard is found in the paraje that we know as Gualtallary "Montasterio." It takes its name from the stream that descends from the Jaboncillo Hills towards the El Peral Hills. It represents the perfect balance between landscape and vineyard.

With its rows of vines integrated among extensive canyons of native vegetation and its rich relief of ravines and hills, each parcel displays a unique identity, reflecting the richness of Gualtallary.

Very heterogeneous alluvial soils, influenced by the Jaboncillo Hills. Sandy top soils and subsoils with alluvial stones covered in calcium carbonate and caliche, a unique type of natural cement made of clay, stones and sand.

Main varieties planted: Malbec, Cabernet Franc, Chardonnay.



A WINERY ROOTED IN THE VINEYARD

When we began our journey in the Uco Valley, we sought those places that had captivated us with the unique expression of their wines. In the early years, we learned a lot about the genesis and diversity of the soils. We started dividing our vineyards by soil type, and only then, after forming our philosophy, did we begin to build the winery.

THE BUILDING IS A TRIBUTE TO THE MOUNTAIN

In 2016, we inaugurated our Zuccardi Valle de Uco winery. It is our tribute to the mountain range. From the first moment, we wanted it to be part of the environment, integrating completely into the landscape. To construct it, we used only natural materials from the area: stones, sand and water. Surrounded by native vegetation, it is entirely made of concrete, both inside and out, from the stone walls to the vessels for the elaboration and aging of our wines.
